
Festival Opening Times 2024:

Walk at Tyne Green, Hexham - Tue 12 March


We will be hoping to enjoy the spring sunshine with a walk on Tyne Green, Hexham followed by coffee at Café Enna.






Upcoming Trips


The coach will leave Hexham and pick up in Prudhoe to arrive in time for the matinee performance.

From pretty florals and quirky prints to sparkly and iridescent fabrics. The room was buzzing with chatter, activity and teamwork to create these fabulous creatures. Pottery - Rustic Soap Dishes

In our January pottery sessions we have been making 'rustic soap dishes'. This included developing our slab-building, joining and texturing skills to make pieces which are both decorative and functional. There are some beautiful creations and Mel will be coating them all in stoneware glaze. Look out for some photos of the finished pieces coming soon.





Boccia (pronounced Bot-cha)

Being quite new to Chrysalis Club, I hadn't seen Boccia played before. I noticed that there is a definite competitive spirit in the room, with lots of chatter and laughter going on in this session.

Boccia is similar to bowls and pétanque, and originates in South America. More recently it has become a Paralympic sport, introduced in 1984. The balls contain plastic granules so they don't bounce but still roll.
