We've had a busy couple of months on the trips front, with lots of visits and events including an Alpaca encounter, a trip back in time, a musical interlude and a couple of cinema treats.





My current studio is at <u>The Hearth Arts Centre</u> - my base since 2004 - in ideal proximity to rugged countryside, city and coast which happily fit with my work ideas and themes.

Artworks are available to view at my studio but I also exhibit in group and solo



shows around the UK and am a member of the Northern Potters' Association.

I enjoy sharing my love of clay with people of all ages and abilities. I have run ceramics/pottery workshops in schools, museums and community venues and regular sessions for people living with dementia at Chrysalis.
