Last year was an amazing one for Chrysalis; some of the highlights were:

- Recruiting some new high quality volunteers to compliment the existing experienced team
- Running a huge event at Hexham Mart featuring our patron, the popular local author, Mari Hannah who brought along her friend Ann Cleeves. We raised almost £9,000
- Increasing the membership to a level where we have had to have a waiting list for some sessions


## Fundraising

## Planetarium Show at the Twice Brewed Inn - Tuesday 27th February

We're going to see a film in the purpose built 360 degree immersive dome that brings to life the universe. The planetarium is at the Twice Brewed Inn, near Hadrian's Wall. It is next to the Sill.

This stunning, 30-minute voyage through space and time conveys, through sparkling sights and sounds, the Universe revealed to us by science. From Earth to the Universe, we take you out to the colourful birthplaces and burial grounds of stars, and still further out beyond the Milky Way to the unim-

aginable immensity of myriad galaxies. Along the way, you will learn about the history of astronomy, the invention of the telescope, and today's giant telescopes that allow us to probe ever deeper into the Universe.

There will be a coach leaving from Prudhoe and Hexham to get us there and back, and we will have a meal after the show. Times and costs will be confirmed in the New Year.
