Not only am I a trustee of Chrysalis and a volunteer, but many of you will have seen me recently taking on the role of container gardening tutor in our sessions in Hexham. It has been a pleasure to pass on my knowledge and love for gardening and I have really enjoyed your enthusiasm in choosing and planting up your beautiful planters.



I thought it might be nice to recap what we have done and show you how our planters at Chrysalis have matured over the autumn/winter period into spring and finish with our most recent creations.



Autumn saw us design some winter colour and texture with a hidden surprise for Spring! Find these outside the premises at the minute.

In February we found out about alpine plants and the range of varieties. We tried to recreate an alpine feel in our planter using a top dressing of grit, shells and stones. The one outside the front door is blooming away!

March saw us find out the







difference between primroses and polyanthus - such brightly coloured flowers to help us herald the Spring.

Herbs have been our subject of interest in April with a beautiful pot of Mediterrane-

an herbs to use in cooking, to feel and smell as we pass by as well as to provide valuable food for bees and butterflies when they flower.
